PICASA

Picasa is a software application for organizing and editing digital photos. The program is owned by Google and it is free to use. You may get Windows XP, Windows Vista, Linux and Mac OS X versions from Google site or you can get it from Cnet's downloads and other web sites.

Transfer, find, organize, edit, print and share images, all with this easy-to-use program. Watch Picasa automatically organize your pictures into elegant albums by date. Having all your photos in one place means no more time wasted searching for folders or files. The program works with JPEG, GIF, BMP, PSD, and movie files and is compatible with most digital cameras; it detects your USB driver and imports pictures into albums. Editing tools include cropping (standard or custom), removal of red-eye, and enhancing—even switching from color to black and white. Create side shows set to your MP3s. Integration with Picasa's free Hello instant picture-sharing software lets you share hundreds of photos in seconds and chat in real time. E-mail photos with Picasa's built-in client to take the guesswork out of compressing images, and order photo-lab quality prints or print at home with no mistakes. You can also make instant backups to CD (or to other hard drives) of your photo collections, to organize your photos using labels and stars (just like with Gmail), to write captions for all pictures and to organize videos as well as pictures.

The program now available is 3.1 and the Picasa Web Albums provides 1 gigabyte of free storage but more is available at a fee of \$20 per year for an additional 10 gigabytes and more at a price for each block of storage. No ads are shown on the Picasa Web Albums in either the free or paid accounts.

Hello by Google Picasa was free but it was shut down on June 11,2008 so this part is not available to use.

Check out this program, you will find it useful if you have a digital camera and save your pictures and want to share them with others.

PRODUCT REVIEW **HeatShift Cooling Pad** **By Robert L. Lynch**

A Better Solution to Keep Your Laptop From Giving You An Unwanted LapDance

I recently bought a laptop computer with enough oomph to hopefully replace my XP desktop. I soon discovered two problems. One, when running two or three programs and maybe downloading files the laptop would heat up beyond a comfortable temperature. The other was it came with Vista, but that's another story. I don't have to tell you what heat will eventually do to a computer. This is compounded in a laptop that has electronics jammed into a case to make it as small as possible.

The heat coming from the side vent on my laptop was also warming my left hand pinky as I was typing. I looked through all the advertised on-line metal and plastic fan assemblies to help cool the bottom of the laptop. There were all kinds of configurations, a fan or fans powered by the laptop USB port, fans on aluminum and plastic plates priced anywhere from about \$10 to \$50. After rubbing my tired eyes I gave it one more try to find the Nirvana of coolers. Yreka! I found it! A laptop cooler that won't burn or scratch your legs with the laptop setting on them. The pad can even be rolled up! It doesn't have to use any one of my meager USB ports to power the fans, weights only 4 or 5 ounces. No messy USB wire, no flashing lights, no click-click adjustment knobs, now, will it do the job?

It is called a "HeatShift Cooling Pad" It looks like a kitchen heat pad you use to grab that hot dish out of the oven only larger. It comes in various sizes measured by the size of your computer screen and you can get it in black or white, one site had it in pink. The HeatShift pad has some kind of crystals embedded in the pad that feel lumpy at room temperature. As the computer bottom heats up the crystals slowly turn liquid carrying the heat out over the pad. The cooled crystals "refreeze" back into soft lumps until heated again. the whole pad never become hot; heat is dissipated on the cooler part of the pad away from the hotspots of the CPU and maybe the sound card board.

Wifi Hot Spots You can take advantage of Public WIFI hot spots or start a wireless network in your home. The first thing your need to do is to make sure your computer has the right gear. Most new laptops and newer desktops come with bulit-in transmitters.

If your laptop does not have the right equipment, you can buy a wireless adapter to plug into the USB port. Once the adapter is installed and the driver checked, the computer should automatically start and discover any hot spots in the area. The computer will inform you of the existence of a network an ask whether you want to connect to it. You can access the internet, your email, website or favorites.

Having a home wireless network, allows you to easily connect several computers and to easily move the computers from spot to spot.
